title pages and presented the details necessary for compiling the descriptive notes near the title page.

The work of Valeria Nistor and Maria Micle is a reference work for future cataloguers and cataloguers who practice the profession for years and try to standardise this activity according to international rules.

The exceptional graphic quality and the low cost of the publication renders it all the more valuable.

VLADIMIR F. WERTSMAN

(USA)

Vladimir F. Wertsman (born 6 April 1929) graduated from the faculty of Law of the "Al. I. Cuza" University, Iaşi (1953). He lives in the United States from 1967. He studied librarianship at the School of Library Science, Columbia University, New York (1968-1969). He was reference librarian at the Department of Science and Industry of Brooklyn Public Library, Brooklyn, New York (1969-1974) and assistant branch librarian at Canarsie Branch (1974-1977), Greenpoint Branch (1977-1980) and Leonard Branch (1980-1982), senior librarian at New York Public Library in New York and specialist of Slavonic and Romanian language at Foreign Library, Donnell Library Center (1982-1986).

He was senior librarian at the Learner's Advisory Service and Job Information Center, Midmanhattan Library between 1987 and 1992, consultant of Harvard University in ethnic issues for the Harvard Encyclopedia of American Ethnic Groups (1980) and of the Study Center and Ethnic Publications of Kent State University (1978-1984). He has several publications, most of them in the field of the culture and civilisation of ethnic groups in the United States: The Romanians in America. 1784-1974 (1975), The Ukrainians in America. 1608-1975 (1976), The Russians in America. 1727-1970 (1977), The Armenians in America. 1618-1976 (1978), The Romanians in America and Canada (1980). Romania's history from earliest times to our days interpreted from a non-Marxist point of view. Author was a former chief of the Romanian section of Radio Free Europe in München, Germany, the editor is a Romanian American scholar.

Giurescu, Dinu, ROMANIA'S COMMUNIST TAKEOVER: THE RADESCU GOVERNMENT, Boulder, CO: East European Monographs, 1994. 202 p.

Focuses on Romania's history during the final stages of World War II, the Soviet Occupation and the imposition of a pro-Soviet Communist government.

----- THE RAZING OF ROMANIA'S PAST, New York: World Monument Fund/Kres Foundation, European Preservation Program, 1989. 68 p. Ill.

Romanian scholar documents the destruction of several valuable historical sites and monuments by Communist ruler Nicolae Ceauşescu during the period 1975-1985. Thousands of villages were also demolished.

Rates, Nestor, ROMANIA: THE ENTANGLED REVOLUTION, New York: Praeger/Center for Strategic and International Studies, Washington DC, 1991. 179 p.

Scholarly analysis of the December 1989 anti-Communist revolution in Romania, its nature, political forces and consequences. The author is a former head of the Romanian section of Radio Free Europe, Washington, DC station.

Tismăneanu, Vladimir, PERSONAL POWER AND ELITE CHANGE IN ROMANIA: FINAL REPORT TO NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR SOVIET AND EAST EUROPEAN RESEARCH, Washington, DC: The Council, 1989. 61 p.

A political science university professor sheds light on the last three decades of Communist rule, with special focus on Nicolae Ceauşescu. The author published numerous studies on East European Communism, its various forms of manifestations and decline.

------ THE TRAGICOMEDY OF ROMANIAN COMMUNISM: RESEARCH REPORT TO NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR SOVIET AND EAST EUROPEAN RESEARCH, Washington DC: The Council, 1989. 76 p.

An examination of Romanian government and politics during the last 4 decades, with special attention to Nicolae Ceauşescu's rule and its consequences.

----- FANTASIES OF SALVATION: DEMOCRACY, NATIO-NALISM, AND MYTH IN POST COMMUNIST EUROPE, Princeton, NY: Princeton University Press, 1998. 216 p. An examination of east European societies after the fall of Communism, their governments, politics, and ideologies.

Boia, Eugene, ROMANIA'S DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH YUGOSLAVIA IN THE INTERWAR PERIOD, 1919-1940, New York: Columbia University Press, 1993. 501 p.

Stresses the friendly relations between the two countries, both later caught in the struggle between the great powers, and both victims of fascism and Communism during World War II.

Romania's historical rights over a region annexed by the former Soviet Union in 1940, lost during World War II, and re-annexed in 1944. The largest part of this region is presently called Moldova Republic.

Dima, Nicholas, FROM MOLDAVIA TO MOLDOVA: THE SOVIET ROMANIAN TERRITORIAL DISPUTE, Boulder, CO: East European Monographs, 1991. 194 p. Maps.

This is the second and enlarged edition of the item listed in continuation. The author is a noted scholar and lecturer.

Romanian historical regions annexed by the former Soviet Union in 1940 and re-annexed in 1944, the first currently known as Moldova Republic, and the second incorporated into Ukraine.

Romania's historical rights over two regions, scholarly examined by a professor and formerly president of the American Romanian Academy of Arts and Sciences.

Acribia, the Librarianship students' periodical follows a natural course of evolution, thanks to the enthusiasm and perpetual interest of students which is now enriched with their experience.

Although the design of the periodical is almost unchanged, its content has much improved. The editorial board stabilised this
